ANSWER SHEET

1. The teeth of a T. Rex were up to 7 inches long, about the length of a banana.
2. The T. Rex lived in North America, in areas now part of Canada and the western United States, during the Late Cretaceous period.
3. A T. Rex could run about 20-25 miles per hour, similar to the speed of a car in a neighborhood.
4. The T. Rex's famous nickname is the "King of the Dinosaurs".
5. The T. Rex was a carnivore and likely ate large herbivorous dinosaurs like Triceratops and possibly scavenged carcasses.
6. The T. Rex had such small arms because they may have helped it push itself up from the ground or hold onto prey.
7. The extinction of the T. Rex was likely caused by the mass extinction event at the end of the Cretaceous period, possibly caused by an asteroid impact that led to fires, tsunamis, earthquakes, and a changing climate.
8. Some scientists believe that baby T. Rexes may have been covered in feathers, like a chicken.
9. The T. Rex had surprisingly small arms compared to its huge body.
10. The bite of a T. Rex could apply more than 6 tons of pressure, making it one of the strongest bites of any land animal.
